



IF YOU CARE - HAVE THEM NEUTERED!

- There are approximately 8 million domestic cats in the UK and at least a million undomestic (feral) cats. Statistics prove that a great majority of these are unneutered.
- Cats Protection considers that non-neutering is not an option.
- Kittens and cats can be neutered or spayed (doctored) from 5 months onwards.
- There is no veterinary evidence to prove that it is better for a female cat to have one litter. This is a myth.
- Most people are unaware that one unspayed female cat can be responsible for 20,000 descendants in just five years!
- Neutered male cats are less likely to roam thus becoming stray or feral and reducing the risk of them being run over. They will be less likely to fight, reducing the risk of them contracting and passing on serious diseases, such as FIV and FeLV.
- It is a fallacy that neutering a male cat will “spoil” him. Another old wives’ tale!
